- 1. Meeting called to order by Chair C. MacDonald at 3:03 pm.
- 2. The minutes from November 8, 2010 were approved. Motioned by M. Stimley, seconded by M. Hare (4/0/2)
- 3. New Business
 - a) CIMT program proposal for Ph.D. in Sport Management. Questions were raised about the need for additional faculty resources and projected enrollment; L. Tinnerman motioned we table the discussion until Kiger could be present to answer questions. Kiger was called to the meeting.

- 5. Faculty Senate Representative Report Faculty Performance Evaluation Model will be voted on at the meeting on Thursday, December 16, 2010.
- 6. Dean's Report
 - a) Donor contributions are down slightly (missing Karen O'Rourke's services), 200 letters going out for funding recruitment.
 - b) Hold on faculty searches due to budget restraints.
 - c) Dismissals and academic probations have 24 hour turn around this semester due to late semester grade reporting—must be reported by December 23, 2010.
 - d) Praxis I: 75 accounts purchased to help students pass, 21 students signed up, 3 have logged in to use accounts.
- 3. b) Tinnerman motioned we untable the CIMT discussion based on the arrival of Kiger. Kiger answered several questions. This is a unique program (not widely available) and has the potential for 10-12 students per year. Hare stated it is a growing field. Kiger did not feel that it would presently require additional faculty resources. Tinnerman asked to call the question, (6/1/0).
