- Other Expenses: (costs vary depending on the provider)
 - Health Exam (annual)**
 - Vaccination Review (annual)**
 - TB Test (annual, some sites may require two step/series tests)**
 - Hepatitis B immunization**
 - Personal Health Insurance (continuous throughout the program)**
 - Background Check (may be required multiple times due to individual fieldwork requirements)**
 - Professional Liability Insurance**
 - Professional Dress Required by Fieldwork sites**
 - Classroom participation devices**
- Transportation costs are the responsibility of the student
 - Most Level I and Level II Fieldwork sites are located off campus and require personal transportation**
 - When on Fieldwork, students may also be required to commute or use public transportation dependent on the location of housing**
- Housing costs are the responsibility of the student
 - Fieldwork sites may be local and at a distance (nationwide)
 - Depending on the location, students may need to obtain short term housing to meet
 Fieldwork requirements
- Text Books & Educational Resources
 - Current edition of required textbook(s) and educational resources (\$1500.00 estimated cost all 8 semesters.)
 - Students must abide by copyright laws.
 - Textbook listings can be found listed by course via the <u>dynamic schedule</u>.
 - The OT program does not regulate where you purchase textbooks.

- For convenience, the Barnes and Noble ISU Bookstore also stocks textbooks for purchase.
 - The ISU Bookstore supports ISU students by returning some of the profits from textbook sales to the University for Student Activities and Scholarships

 Select courses may require the student to purchase additional materials
