



# Annual Report 2022 ENROLLMENT MANAGEMENT

## **DEAR COLLEAGUES AND FRIENDS,**



It has been another challenging year for enrollments in higher education. This Fall was the third straight year enrollment tumbled across the US. In Indiana, the college-going rate of high school graduates fell to 52%. This drop marked the state@ lowest college-going rate in recent history.

At Indiana State, our fall enrollment offers many reasons for optimism as the university turns the corner from the COVID-19 pandemic. The institution welcomed 2,544 new students to the university. These enrollments include a first-year class of 1,535, an increase of 7% from the previous year.

Other positive results from this year @ class include the following:

- The percentage of new student enrollments in the Honors College is the highest in ISU<sup>®</sup> history at 20%.
- The percentage gains among African Americans and all students of color are up 18% compared to the previous year.
- ISU experienced enrollment growth in our two largest feeder counties, Vigo and Marion.
- The MBA program had a 58% increase in students.
- ISUĞ new completion program in Leadership and Professional Development enrolled its first students this Fall.
- New and returning students living on campus also experienced increases.



Much work still needs to be done in this new higher education landscape. We will build on the many positives in this data. Our proactive enrollment initiatives, such as the Indiana State Advantage, have had a positive impact. We remain energized and optimistic heading into the future. Go Sycamores!


